GMA President and CEO Cal Dooley Named Head of American Chemistry Council *GMA Board Launches Search for Successor*

(Washington, D.C.) Doug Conant, President and Chief Executive Officer of Campbell Soup Company, and Chairman of the Board of the Grocery Manufacturers Association (GMA), today announced that GMA President and CEO, Cal Dooley, has been named President and CEO of the American Chemistry Council (ACC), and that a search for Dooley's successor is underway.

"I would like to thank Cal Dooley for the leadership he has provided to GMA since taking the helm in January 2007," said Conant. "He has provided tremendous leadership to the association and to the food, beverage and consumer products industry, especially with regard to the recent merger between GMA and the Food Products Association (FPA).

"As a result of the GMA-FPA merger, GMA is now an advocacy, supply chain and scientific powerhouse on behalf of our industry, and the GMA Board of Directors has appointed a search committee that is in the process of finding the right person to lead the organization and to build on GMA's legacy of success," concluded Conant.

Dooley will assume his new duties at ACC on September 8.
